Close to 4 million tons of used clothing go into US landfills each year. Donating clothing to charity is one way to keep it out of landfills. What about ripped and stained clothes? Or worn out shoes and belts? These items are perfectly recyclable. Durham County has four convenience sites which will take such items. The closest site is just 10 minutes north **I Name**: of Northgate Park on Redwood Rd and Electra Drive http://tinyurl.com/recycleclothes.

Durham County has worked with Friendship Used Clothing LLC of Wake County for 3 years to keep textiles out of landfills. Friendship sorts the items and **I** Email: any salvageable clothes go overseas and are donated I Or use PayPal at our website Northgateparknc.org to natural disaster relief efforts. Durham County gets a profit for damaged textiles that can be recycled into rags or stuffing. Just bag up your items, making sure they are dry and not musty, and put into the blue bins. A decal is not needed for recycling clothing, shoes, books and plastics #1-7, etc. at the county convenience sites. A decal is needed for dumping garbage or yard waste.

House Numbering Vital to Safety

In critical situations, good house numbering can save a life. Beyond your own!

First responders use them to find nearby homes and stop fires from spreading, or catch criminals that could circle back to strike you another time.

Home Inspectors recommends numbers should:

1. Be 4 inches tall minimum and thick enough (1/2 inch);

2. Contrast in color with the background. (Reflective numbers highly recommended for night viewing);

3. Not be obscured by objects or landscaping from wide view ability;

4. Face the street that is the house address;

5. Be clearly displayed at driveway's end or painted onto curbside if house isn't visible from the road.



Yellow Jackets & Their Stings

Yellow Jacket Facts: The Eastern Yellow Jacket is a type of wasp that build its nest in the ground. The peak season, when nests can contain as many as 10,000 insects is late summer. They can be distinguished from honey bees by watching their flight. Bees fly more in straight line to their nectar source. Yellow Jackets fly in erratic zigzag patterns, searching for wood to use to increase the size of their nests. They have strong mandibles for chewing the wood, barbed stingers and can sting and bite repeatedly. They are drawn to cooking meat on outdoor grills as well as sweet drinks.

If left undisturbed, you may not know you have a nest near you. Encounters occur when the Yellow Jacket senses vibrations or is out foraging for nest building materials. Vibrations could be caused by mowing or walking over their nest hole or even dropping a rake near the hole. Their reaction is to sense danger to their nest and they defend aggressively, swarming out and attacking the closest object.

Reactions to a sting range from pain, swelling, redness and when healing, itchiness. If you know you are severely allergic to stings, administer an Epinephrine dose (pin injections) immediately and seek medical attention. Single stings can be treated with first washing the area with an antiseptic or alcohol to begin breaking down the protein based venom. Follow with ice, Benadryl antihistamine dose and as healing begins, hydrocortisone creams aid in reducing the redness, swelling and itching.

Is stung repeatedly, play it safe and seek medical help immediately. Other more severe symptoms include: difficulty breathing, dizziness, chills, fever, hives and joint pain.
