#### Lavender House Update

Have you been hearing the words 'Lavender House' lately 'round the neighborhood? The foundation nestled in the woods across from the main park was once a house built in the 1930s (!) for the park ranger and his family. In 1946, it then housed the Children's Museum, now known as the Museum of Life and Science who moved up to their campus off Murray Avenue. Then to now a storage space for Parks and Rec, and after many decades of flooding (it sits in Ellerbe Creek's 100 year floodplain!) it was not possi-





ble to use/repair, and was deconstructed. Over a few seasons and with much input from NG residents and DPF collaborators, the space has finally been refurbished as an open play/performance space, with plans for future features (ecological, historical, botanical and artistic!) and activities.

The design and execution won \*TWO\* 2018 City/County Golden Leaf Awards (Neighborhood Garden & Landscape & the Keep Durham Beautiful Award). On Thursday April 26, over 70 residents and special guests from the Museum, DPR, KDB, and NPNA enjoyed a rededication/opening celebration with cake, historical presentations, speakers and three delightful music & dance performances from special guests from our sister neighborhood's cultural treasure Walltown Children's Theater. A great time was had by all! Watch the space in the coming

### New Path at Beaver Marsh

Beaver Marsh is Ellerbe Creek Watershed Association's nature preserve right behind Compare Foods, off Avondale Road. It is the home to an active beaver colony and also to a wide range of other wildlife - deer, raccoons, otters, coyotes, mink, turtles, Blue Heron, White Egret and more.


There are several existing paths to walk as you enjoy the woods and views of the marsh and now there is a new path! Not yet named, this path runs from Harbor Freight down to Public Storage,



running alongside the creek for most of its length and making it possible to now do a full circuit of the preserve. The path also crosses a tributary where the marsh drains in to Ellerbe Creek with views of tiered dams made by the beavers to hold water in the marsh.
