### Northgate Park Neighborhood Association Bylaws

For the past two years, NPNA's Board has been working to revise the Bylaws for the association. We now have a document that defines us a non-profit with the intent to facilitate community involvement, brands us as an inclusive organization and clarifies how we operate. The entire document is available online at <a href="http://northgateparknc.org/">http://northgateparknc.org/</a> If you want to read a print version, a copy will be available at future business meetings. Meeting are held on the third Thursday each month at 7:00 pm at the Friendly Civitan Clubhouse, 2510 Glendale Ave, Durham.

Because the NPNA Board feels the community is an inclusive community, the first change was the addition of this statement to the Bylaws:

Section 4. Northgate Park Neighborhood Association does not discriminate for any reason including but not limited to race, color, national origin, religion, sex, gender identification (including gender expression,) sexual orientation, disability, age or any status protected by law.

Other major changes add the potential for more membership involvement at the Board meeting, clarify the duties of Board members and refine quorum for both Board meeting and the general meeting. The primary reason to address the definition of quorum for the general meeting was to emphasis that the general membership is important in the decision-making process. Instead of a general statement that could be interpreted that only Board members' votes are counted, the wording now states that if quorum is reached, the attending membership passes a motion or elects officers with a simple majority.

With this revision of the Bylaws, the membership has the possibility of electing as many as 12 atlarge members on the Board. Because we have such a vibrant community, the hope is more members will want to serve.



### Very brief review of presentation on Ellerbe Creek

On Feb 21 just prior to the NPNA board meeting, three speakers (City, County and Ellerbe Creek Watershed Association) reviewed the history of Ellerbe Creek and flood water control in Durham and the current situation. Loss of forestation and increased impermeable surfaces (houses, driveways, streets) have caused a marked increase in flooding and erosion. Durham City, working with Durham County, was able to secure funding to help mitigate the severe erosion that has occurred on several of the lots in Northgate Park.
