#### Leash the beast and scoop the poop!

Owning a dog is both a pleasure and a responsibility that impacts not just you and your dog but other members of the public too. All dogs must be on a leash when off their owner's property. There have been several incidents over the past year of dogs being attacked within the neighborhood by unleashed dogs resulting in serious injuries and high expenses for the owners of the attacker.

Durham dog owners who do not clean up after their dog on any public property/right of way or on private property without the owner's permission are subject to fines of \$50 for a first violation, \$100 for a second and \$150 for all subsequent violations. Dog poop left lying around is both a health hazard and pollutes storm water run-off in to creeks.

Dog waste left on the ground increases exposure of you, your neighbors and our community to bacteria, viruses and parasites. Fecal coliform bacteria/Salmonella - bacteria/Hookworms, roundworms and tapeworms - parasites/Toxoplasma gondii - virus/The EPA considers dog waste a pollutant of water bodies and it is most often introduced in to receiving waters by way of storm water run-off.
