Carrie Heinonen, President & CEO at the Museum of Life and Science

The Museum of Life and Science is a major institution in the middle of a neighborhood. With that juxtaposition in mind, Carrie is a big believer in reaching out and getting feedback from the community.

- Visibility into upcoming changes
 - 2016 Bond Funding, updates included: Woodland classrooms, Earth Moves exhibit, Parking Deck, animal quarantine building, Barnes Welcome Hall, Play to Learn Area, Warehouse, Wetland Walkway
 - Earth Moves won a Silver Medal for design at the International Design Awards & Play to Learn won a Bronze both thanks to the museum's in-house design team
 - o Fiscal Year 2023
 - 640,000 visitors and growing!
 - 86,000 free visitors (community days, Durham Public School trips, teachers, free under 3)
 - Outreach programs actively working within community to identify families that would benefit from discounted memberships
 - 17,000 member households aiming for 10% of this total to be discounted membership households
 - NOAA named museum as a <u>Center for Excellence</u>
 - 2022 Bond Funding, upcoming plans: Weather exhibit expanded into Climate focus, working with biotechnology companies to upgrade upstairs exhibits, amenities for growing visitorship including cafe expansion for multi-season utilization, dark sky compliant lighting to accommodate additional afterhours events
- Feedback/questions/suggestions:
 - Meeting rooms are available to rent! Essentially the entire facility is open to rent in some way, shape or form. losts of size spaces.
 - Including their international design <u>award winning woodland classrooms</u>
 - Museum can facilitate team building programs and events as well as renting space
 - <u>Birthday parties</u> still held there (Saturdays & Sundays)
 - Summer Camp held annually
- Discussion of Murray Ave improvement opportunities:
 - Speedbumps, light, etc. have been added
 - Many would like to see the bus stop returned to the Museum area (Edison Johnson, etc.)
 - Community members can vocalize desire to local officials (city, county)
 - would involve cross-town route addition (currently doesn't exist) very long term vision
 - Go Durham & Bike Durham

 - Listserv opportunities for added awareness
 - 1st day of summer camp, pickup/drop-off times, holidays at the park evening events, etc. to help folks adjust commutes/schedules/known about

• Recounted recent violent crime incidents within the neighborhood

- 106 E Club Blvd shooting incident, along with other shooting and car theft incidents
- Chris is here reaching out and imploring neighbors to join together in advocating for a safer community and acknowledging that no one is sure how to go about that
- Information given on <u>PAC 2</u> (Partners Against Crime District 2) an potential avenue for further communication & information from law enforcement and city organizations
 - Meeting is at Edison Johnson, 2nd Monday of every month
 - Calling and reporting even small, minor incidents helps create a clearer picture of crime in our neighborhood - leading to potential appropriate staffing of resources in our area
